- 1981** AANA was officially created, formerly the North American Chapter of IAA.
- 1982** The first annual meeting was held at the Drake Hotel in Chicago. Bylaws and articles of incorporation were approved along with six committees.
- 1983** *The Journal of Arthroscopy and Related Surgery* was created with a subscription price of \$60 that was incorporated into member dues.
- 1985** Simulation technology is explored for arthroscopy surgical education with the guidance of Howard Sweeney, M.D.
- 1986** The journal continued to grow to a readership of more than 2,700 and began a video supplement, which cost \$250 per installment.
- 1987** AANA joined Specialty Day at the AAOS Annual Meeting, which grew to be the largest Specialty Day meeting.
- 1988** AANA made strides both operationally and for its membership, including identifying the need for a skills lab in Chicago and establishing an AIDS policy at skills courses.
- 1989** The journal circulation grew to more than 3,800 with a growing international readership. Honorary Membership category was established.



CELEBRATING 40 YEARS OF EXCELLENCE

2021 marked AANA's 40th Anniversary – a celebration of not only how far we have come, but how we're advancing in the next 40. AANA has been and will continue to be a beacon for the advancement of arthroscopy and minimally invasive surgery, and remains an integral component of success for the practicing Orthopaedic Surgeon.

AANA makes tremendous strides and achievements with each new year, and 2021 was without exception. Diversity and Inclusion in orthopaedics were prioritized as areas of improvement. Throughout 2021, we increased female and minority representation across the podium spotlight. We saw an increase in the number of women who attended the annual AANA/SOMOS Course. And for the first time ever, we set a collaboration with the Ruth Jackson Orthopaedic Society (RJOS) for our 2022 Specialty Day programming with 50% female faculty.

While unforeseeable, the COVID-19 pandemic tried and tested AANA's implementation of surgical education and brought AANA's online learning activities front and center. Webinar Wednesdays, a series that launched in 2020, took a strong cadence in 2021, with at least one new webinar and over 200 attendees registered bi-monthly. These webinars featured partnerships with ASPETAR, SLARD and the Hawkins Foundation/Sharecare.

Additionally, the AANA DocMatter Community, an interactive platform where members can exchange ideas and discuss surgical cases, saw tremendous growth, with over 770,000 views and 100 new discussion posts. The platform continues to see member engagement at an all-time high of 73%.

Part of AANA's ability to continue leading in arthroscopy and minimally invasive surgery advancement involves providing education to the next generation of AANA leaders and Orthopaedic Surgeons. The new AANA Fellowship Education Series does just that and remains successful, reaching more than 50 fellowship programs and just under 200 Orthopaedic Residents/Fellows in 2021 compared to 10 programs in 2020.

As we conclude the commemoration of this important milestone and charge ahead to AANA's 50th, we are enthusiastic about all that the organization can accomplish in the next year, the next decade and the next 40. We hope you are as inspired as we are at the possibilities!

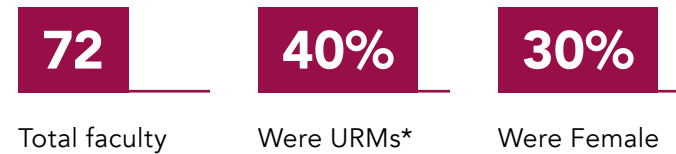

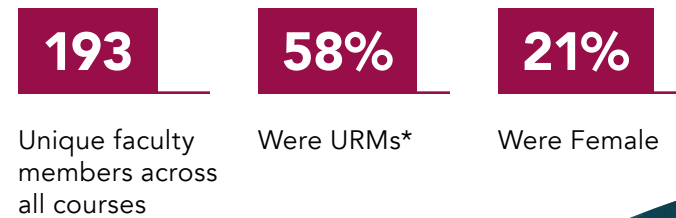

1990–1991 The Academy purchased a building in Rosemont, where AANA ultimately rented space and put down roots. Meanwhile, the CDC issued guidelines for the use of cadavers in skills courses which initiated the planning for courses at the OLC.

1992 The journal increased distribution to six editions per year due to continued growth and interest.

1993 AANA joined it's 1,000th member! A huge milestone for a rapidly growing organization.

1994 The Membership Committee revised the join process and eliminated the requirement for members to be observed during surgery prior to their approval.

1995 The AANA Board of Directors acknowledge the importance of an internet presence and approved the proposal to establish an AANA website.

1996 The AANA Board of Directors approved a strategic planning workshop to give focus to the next 3–5 years of AANA's activities.

1997 AANA held the largest Specialty Day program at the AAOS Annual Meeting.

MEMBERSHIP

Beginning in 1981 with 322 members, AANA has grown into a global community of more than 5,900 medical professionals with an expansive reach of 77 countries. This growth demonstrates the increased demand and importance of minimally invasive orthopaedic surgery worldwide. The supportive benefits, hands-on skills training and culmination at annual meetings have been depended on for 40 years. AANA looks forward to a future of continued growth and advancement with the support of its membership.

NEW BENEFIT HIGHLIGHT!

AANA engaged new partners, Hawkins and Sharecare, to provide a member discounted program for the Merit-based Incentive Payment System (MIPS). Value-based care and patient outcomes tracking is important for reimbursement and many private practice and small practice members do not have a great system at their disposal to manage the necessary information and patient measures. This partnership provides a list of offerings to members from basic data tracking to advanced coaching in MIPS at a discounted rate to all AANA members.



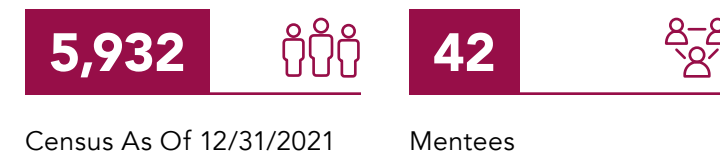

2000 14 AANA Lab Courses were held at the OLC, educating 480 Orthopaedic Surgeons.

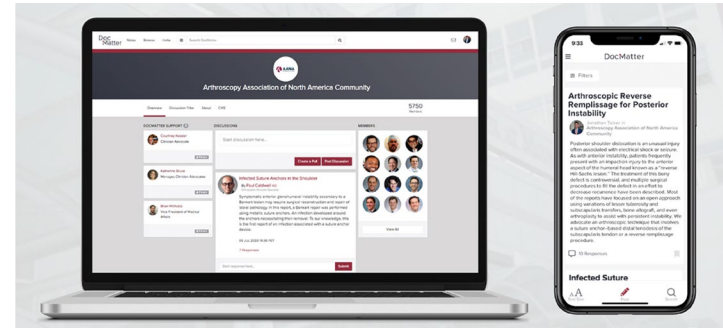
2001 AANA created a coding manual on CD-ROM and an Educational Overview Task Force was created to assess AANA's CME activities.

2005 AANA received renewed certification from ACCME, including a letter of commendation.

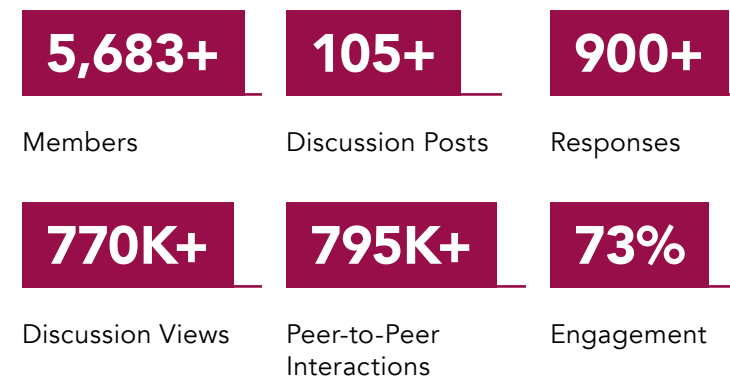

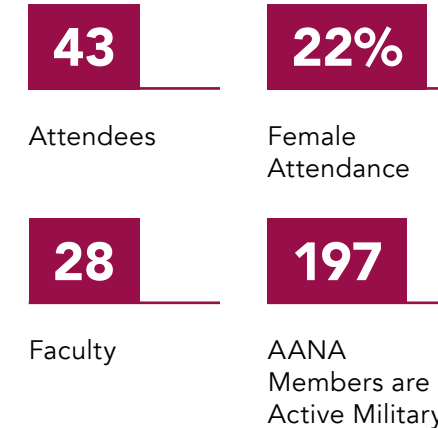

2021 AANA/SOMOS KNEE COURSE

Military Orthopaedic Surgeons were invited to the Orthopaedic Learning Center in Rosemont, Illinois for the AANA/SOMOS Knee Course. This annual two-day intense program is designed to provide cutting-edge education and hands-on arthroscopic techniques to the military Orthopaedic Surgeons. A combination of lecture and lab demystifies many arthroscopic knee procedures, live demonstrations further clarify procedures and experienced faculty are present to help guide attendees to achieve learning goals.



MILITARY ADVANCED SURGICAL TRAINING (MAST)



The MAST program represents several years of work to fund and establish the ideal arthroscopic curriculum for military Orthopaedic Surgeons. Made possible by tremendous efforts from AANA and the Society of Military Orthopaedic Surgeons (SOMOS), the MAST project is focused on empirically demonstrating skill degradation in Rotator Cuff and Bankart repairs in military orthopaedic surgeons after an extended absence (typically due to deployment) and subsequent improvement after post-absence training.

BROWN FAMILY FOUNDATION MILITARY SCHOLARSHIPS

Thanks to a grant received from the Brown Family Foundation, AANA welcomed 11 Military Orthopaedic Surgeons, from the US and International services, to attend one of the four offered AANA Advanced Lab courses in 2021. These advanced arthroscopic training courses allow attendees the unique opportunity to work closely with leading faculty while participating in interactive panel discussions and real-world case-based presentations. Attendees gained insightful pearls that can be immediately applied to their own practice.

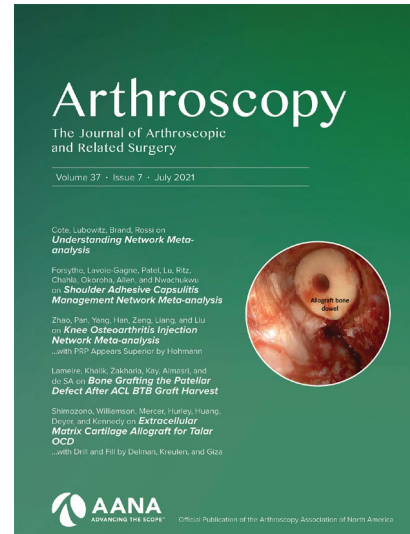
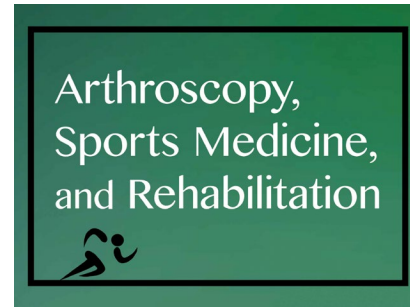
PUBLICATIONS
